EMT Academy Enrollment Requirements

Program Overview:

Before completing this application, read thoroughly all requirements. Though the process is lengthy, this is a program that affords students the opportunity to fill a critical need in the community. The EMT is a link from the scene to the emergency health care system. You will see, hear, and smell things that may be disturbing in this critical care setting, so you need to be sure you want to participate in this opportunity.

This EMT Academy in partnership with Laurel Ridge Community College prepares students for certification as a Virginia and/or National Registry EMT. When students complete the following courses available in the academy, they will have met the requirements to earn the Emergency Medical Technician Career Studies
Certificate. These Courses in the EMT Academy are also aligned with the first semester of the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Emergency Medical Services. Students who successfully complete all courses below will be awarded a Laurel Ridge Medallion and be recognized at a spring awards ceremony at the college.

EMS 100 - CPR for Healthcare Providers 1 cr

EMS 111 - Emergency Medical Technician 7 cr.

EMS 120 - Emergency Medical Technician - Clinical 1 cr.

ENG 111 - College Composition I 3 cr.

PSY 230 - Developmental Psychology 3 cr.

SDV 100 - College Success Skills 1 cr.

Cost:

All tuition and fees associated with courses offered in this Academy are paid by Frederick County Public Schools. Students not wishing to pursue the Emergency Medical Technician Career Studies Certificate may opt to take only the EMS courses listed.

Transportation:

Transportation is provided from each high school via the Governor's School bus daily. Alternate transportation must be approved by Laurel Ridge, the school principal, and the parent.

Admission Requirements:

Admission to the EMT Academy is a selective process that begins with this school-based application. To apply, the student must meet criteria listed below. Upon acceptance of this school-based application, a meeting must be scheduled with the Career Coach to determine the student meets all college requirements:

- passed the Algebra I SOL
- passed the Biology SOL
- have GPA of 2.0 or better if only taking EMS courses
- have GPA of 3.0 or better if taking all courses in first semester of EMS certificate
- be at least 16 years of age by the first day of classes



A mandatory orientation and additional state EMS applications must be completed as part of admittance to this one-year program under the guidance of the Laurel Ridge instructor.

State requirements are that students must:

- Be proficient in reading, writing and speaking the English language.
- Be a minimum of 16 years of age at the beginning date of the EMT course in August. *If you are under 18 years of age, you must provide your instructor with a completed parental permission form with the signature of a parent or guardian verifying approval for enrollment in the course.*
- Have no physical or mental impairment that would render you unable to perform all practical skills required at the EMT level.
- Successfully complete the EMS 100 course upon the beginning of the Academy in order to obtain certification in an Office of Emergency Medical Services approved cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course. This certification must also be current at the time of state testing.
- Not have been convicted of or found guilty of any crime, offense or regulatory violation, or participated in any other prohibited conduct identified in state EMS regulation 12VAC5-31-910.
- Be clean and neat in appearance.
- May not be under the influence of any drugs or intoxicating substances that impairs your ability to
 provide patient care or operate a motor vehicle while in class or performing clinicals, while on duty or
 when responding or assisting in the care of a patient. Students must submit to background checks and
 drug screens to be part of this program. Frederick County Public Schools will assist you in scheduling
 your drug screening.
- Complete no less than 10 clinical hours as prescribed by The Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services.

Sample Schedule:

Class meetings are based on the Laurel Ridge Academic Calendar, not Frederick County Public Schools. Students will work with counselors to determine their schedule on days they may not be at Laurel Ridge in classes.

Action Items for Admission or Waitlist:

		Complete this application and work with your counselor and career coach to ensure all artifacts are included prior to submission.
		Await receipt of letter of admission or waitlist from Frederick County CTE Supervisor.
		Sign and return enrollment agreement as instructed if accepted into the program.
Act	ion	Items that must be completed by the start of the program if accepted:
		Physical: Receive a routine physical using the Laurel Ridge physical form provided by your Laurel Ridge EMS instructor. Any healthcare provider may complete the physical. If you have had a physical within the past six months, your physician may simply complete the form for you if they are willing to do that.
		Background Check/ Fingerprinting: Follow the instructions provided by your Laurel Ridge EMS instructor at the orientation meeting to complete this task.
		Drug Screen: The CTE Supervisor will email the student a form to take to Amherst Family Practice for screening. Results will be directed to your Laurel Ridge EMS instructor. Students who do not pass the drug screen cannot be accepted in the program per state guidelines listed above.
		Student Permission Form: If you are under age 18 at the start of the program, parents/guardian must accompany you to the orientation session and sign the permission form provided by the Laurel Ridge EMS instructor at the orientation session.
		Human Subject Form: Students must sign this form provided by your Laurel Ridge EMS instructor. Parents/Guardians must also sign if students are under the age of 18.
		Laurel Ridge Photo Release Form: Please complete this form provided by your Laurel Ridge EMS instructor.

Additional information to consider:

- Students will need to know or bring their Social Security Number and Driver's License Number on the first day of class in order to complete additional forms. If a student already has an Office of EMS Portal Log-in, please bring this information as well. (If students are volunteers, they may already have this information.)
- For students to complete clinical hours with the clinical partner, Valley Health, and receive credit for the
 course EMS 120, they must be fully COVID vaccinated by the start of clinicals in October. Valley
 Health may accept medical exemptions. See the Laurel Ridge EMS instructor if you need additional
 information. Students will also need to obtain a flu vaccine in the fall of the current year when it
 becomes available.
- There will be additional documentation provided by the Laurel Ridge EMS instructor upon the start of class that must be completed for students to be able to participate in clinicals with Valley Health.



- Students may want to sign up for text / email alerts at Laurel Ridge Alert or by texting laurelalert (all
 one word) to 226787 to receive alerts from Laurel Ridge Community College regarding inclement
 weather. If the college is closed or Mountain Vista Governor's School is closed or virtual, you will not
 have in-person class. Your Laurel Ridge EMS instructor may still have virtual class, so always
 communicate with the instructor.
- All students will need to be fit tested for a N-95 mask. The EMS program will provide several evenings
 at the beginning of the school year where it can be done for free. If you can't make those dates you may
 need to find another place to get it done and there may be a fee. The wearing of a N-95 mask may be
 required on clinical or field rotations. The program will supply the N-95 masks to all students at no
 charge.
- Students may need to purchase liability insurance. Details will be provided at the orientation.
